How 2+2 Works

- The 2+2 is a four-year plan that leads to a Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) degree in Agribusiness Management at Illinois College. Students will fill out applications for both schools, consult the advisors and catalogs from both schools for specifics. This completion guide is designed to ensure graduation in four years by taking courses full-time at both John Wood Community College and Illinois College. This guide assumes students have met all course prerequisites required by John Wood Community College (JWCC) and admission requirements for Illinois College.
- Upon completion of the first two years' requirements at JWCC, students will receive an Associate in Arts with an Emphasis in Agriculture (A.A.) degree.
- A minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.00 should be achieved for admission to Illinois College and maintained to graduate as an Agribusiness Management major.
- Upon transfer to Illinois College, a maximum of 88 semester hours of course work will transfer to Illinois College.
- Students will be required to complete all Agricultural major requirements at Illinois College and any remaining general education requirements.
